GUIDELINES FOR EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

- Get the person's attention before beginning to speak.
- Keep your face and mouth visible (be aware of lighting).
- Face the person directly when speaking.
- Speak clearly, slowly, distinctly, but naturally, without shouting or exaggerating mouth movements.
- Only one person should speak at a time.
- Avoid talking too rapidly or using sentences that are too complex.
- Reduce background noise.
- Speak clearly and at a moderate pace.
- Write down information or key words.
- Use interpreters when necessary.

DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING FACT SHEET



An estimated 1 in 5 American teens experiences some type of hearing loss. (Hearing Loss Association of America)

§ 80% of kids between the ages of six and 19 have hearing loss as a result of listening to loud music, particularly through earbuds at unsafe volumes. (Hearing Loss Association of America)

About 2 to 3 out of every 1,000 children in the United States are born deaf or hard-of-hearing. Nine out of every 10 children who are born deaf are born to parents who can hear.

<u>eterans</u>

Loss of hearing is the number one war wound among American veterans. Half of all blast-related injuries sustained result in permanent hearing loss for veterans. (Hearing Loss Association of America)

> **6 2.7 million** veterans receive either disability compensation for service-connected hearing disabilities or are in treatment for hearingrelated issues. (Hearing Loss Association of America)

★More than 30 million Americans are exposed to hazardous levels of noise in their workplace.

There is a strong relationship between age and reported hearing loss. The following groups show a hearing loss: 18% of adults 45-64 years old, 30% adults 65-74, and 47% of adults 75 years old or older. (National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders)



- Nearly 33% of all American's over the age of 65 have a hearing loss. (Hearing Loss Association of America)
- Recent studies conducted by the National Institute on Aging reveals a link between untreated hearing loss and dementia, a greater incidence of balance problems, falls and stress related diseases such as heart disease and stroke.
